Meet Format

The format of the Meet is a two-round progression, one heat, and a final for all skaters. The number of finals is based on the number of skaters in the heats. Progression to finals will be determined by the number of skaters in each group and then by position and next fastest. The Super Events are based on overall points. All athletes will skate in a Super, (A, B, C...) for their longest distance.

We are proud to be part of the Heartland Racing Series. A season-long circuit of short track speed skating open class races to develop passion and skills for racing.

New this season: US Speedskating Midwest Champion. The overall Heartland points winners (men and women) will be awarded the US Speedskating Midwest Champions. US Speedskating will present the winners with awards and recognition through US Speedskating communications

New this season: The ISU "Zero False Starts" rule will apply to all Heartland races. Skaters are disqualified after one false start.

Team Trophy & Individual Medals

The Team Trophy will be presented to the team with the most overall points. Points are awarded to the top 4 places of the A finals. 1st place gets 5 points, 2nd gets 3, 3rd gets 2, and 4th gets 1. Should there be a tie, the tie breaker will be the team with the most 1st places finishes.

Awards will be given to the first, second and third place finishers overall in each division (male and Female), determined by place/points. Points are awarded for each final as indicated in the table below. If there are A and B finals the B skaters are placed after the A skaters.

Tom has worked with National Team coaches Pat Wentland and Wilma Boonstra, as well as National and Olympic coaches Jereon Otter and Susan Ellis. Tom bases his technique-driven program

on coach Ellis's theory of proper skating.

Throughout his storied Speedskating career, Tom has worn many hats. In addition to competing at both the regional and National levels, Tom has been the Chief Competitor steward for multiple events including the Jr. World Short Tracks in Warsaw, Poland; and the World Short Tracks in Seoul, South Korea. Tom has also been the Meet Director for multiple National Long Track and Short Track Championships including Olympic Trials, and World Championships.

In March 2020 Tom retired from his job with Citizen Advocates Inc. to take on a new position with the Adirondack North Country Sport Council. His job as Sport Manager for Speedskating made him responsible for organizing the 2022 Empire State Winter Games, the 2022 World University Championship for Speed Skating, and the Short Track and Speed Skating events for the 2023 University Games. Tom currently directs the Lake Placid Olympic Speed Skating Oval. His position with the Olympic Regional Development Authority also entails developing Short and Long Track programming. Tom's long-term goal is to reestablish a full-time Long Track and Short Track Program in Lake Placid that offers world-class coaching and venues, affordable housing, access to universities and colleges, and employment opportunities for athletes that allow them to work and train.

Go to the start and get ready for the Heartland Racing

The HRS is a season-long circuit of seven short track open class competitions. The series is hosted by some of the most popular and established meets in the U.S. and runs alongside their other racing divisions.

The HRS is open to qualified Juniors, Seniors, and Masters from anywhere in the United States as well as skaters from Canada and other ISU member countries. Skaters not eligible are encouraged to enter the appropriate age class or ability division offered by the meets hosting the Heartland Series races.

To qualify, skaters must be at least 12 years old (as of 7/1/24) and meet the qualifying 1000m time of 1:48.0 for men and 1:58.0 for women. Skaters will compete in at least three distances - 500m, 1000m, and 1500m. Competitors will skate a minimum of two races per distance, a qualifier and a final, except for the 1500m which may be run as a super final. Meets are encouraged to include a 4th distance of 777m if their schedule permits. Skaters will earn final points based on the standings in each distance. Depending on the number of Heartland registrants and at the discretion of the hosting Meet Director, the division may be divided into Heartland A and Heartland B based on a roughly 50/50 split of submitted times. The point totals from each distance from the skater's best 3 meets in the Series will be summed together to create the overall Series ranking in each distance and the all-around category. A ranking by time in each distance will also be kept. A skater can compete in more than 3 Heartland meets during the season and use the results from the best 3 meets for overall Series ranking.

New: US Speedskating Midwest Champion: The overall points winners (men and women) will be awarded the US Speedskating Midwest Champions. US Speedskating will present the winners with awards and recognition though US Speedskating communications.

New: False Starts: The ISU "Zero False Starts" rule will apply to all Heartland races. Skaters are disqualified after one false start.

The series will be organized based on ISU rules except as stated in the Heartland Rules and Regulations.
